Looking Back: June 2022 - July 2021

June 24, 2022: The KBHSAA marked the 131st Anniversary of its founding by the 1891 graduating class at the annual Distinguished Alumni Awards (DAA) Banquet held at the Kenosha Country Club this past Saturday, June 18. Our attendance figures were down this year with only 63 reservations. We find the fourth weekend in June seems to work better for this event due to competing schedules, such as graduation parties, playoffs for Bradford sports teams and Father's Day Weekend, and we're already looking at venues, hoping to secure Saturday, June 24, 2023 for next year's event.

The KBHSAA Scholarship Fund Silent Auction commenced at 5:00PM, and the bidding wars heated up after dinner. When the auction ended at 7:30PM, the event had raised \$3,223 for the KBHSAA Scholarship Fund! Randy Vaccaro '73, KBHSAA President, welcomed everyone to the event and thanked the volunteers who serve on the KBHSAA Board for their service this year. He also thanked all KBHSAA members for their generous support of the Alumni Association's programs.

Oliver Debe '09 served as the master of ceremonies for the evening, and he acknowledged the efforts of the volunteers who worked on the DAA Plaque Restoration Project (highlighted in a post on the Home Page dated 02/03/2022), as well as the Board members who served on the following committees:

May 2, 2022: KBHSAA Board member Joyce Sorensen '69 reports she was in attendance at the Arbor Day tree planting here in Kenosha and was kind enough to share a few photos. We went out and about today to gather the remaining photos for this post. On Thursday, April 28, and Friday, April 29, the City of Kenosha marked its annual Arbor Day commemoration program by planting trees in remembrance of six community leaders who passed away during 2021.

We're highlighting all of the honorees here, several of whom have connections to Bradford High School, KUSD and KBHSAA, in recognition of their service to our hometown community:



Michael H. Dean, Class of 1960

Mike's creativity and excellence in teaching twice earned him Teacher of the Year honors for the Janesville school district. He was known for making his classes fun, and he took time for each of his students. Upon his retirement, he moved back to Kenosha and went on to serve as a volunteer at and Board member for the Kenosha Public Museums. He also served as a long-time KBHSAA Board member.

Donald Holland

Donald's long career in civil service included stints as Kenosha's Director of Public Works (1964-1986) and as City Administrator (1986-1993); he was instrumental in creating the Southport Marina after the site of the former Simmons Mattress factory/American Motors auto plant was shuttered. Upon his retirement, he served as Alderman for the Third District (1996-2010).





John Hosmanek

Mr. Hosmanek joined KUSD as Assistant principal of Lincoln Jr. High in 1960, then in 1962, became principal of the newly-built Lance Jr. High and took the reins as principal of Tremper High School in 1970. From 1979-1989, he served as KUSD Superintendent and, after retirement, he maintained the KUSD historical archives housed at the KUSD Educational Support Center.

Gilbert "Gib" Ostman

Many may fondly recall Mr. Ostman from our days at Bradford High as a somewhat stern but extremely patient and kind Driver's Ed teacher, who made sure we learned and followed the rules of the road in pursuit of our "temps" and finally, our Wisconsin Drivers' License. He also taught at Bullen Jr. High and after retiring, served on the KUSD Board of Education.





<u>Judy Rossow</u>, along with her husband Gordy, owned the first "quick print" business in Kenosha: The Copy Center. She was instrumental in saving the historic Rhode Opera House from the wrecking ball and was also integral in creating the "Bowls and Books" fundraiser, the proceeds of which have funded repairs and renovations at the Rhode. She also served as a volunteer for Kenosha area civic organizations too numerous to mention here.

Joyce Hill Westerman, Class of 1943

From 1945-1952, Joyce played with the All-American Girls' Professional Baseball League, whose members were recognized by the Baseball Hall of Fame in 1988 and were honored by the 1991 movie, "A League of Their Own." Following her professional baseball career, she continued her love of the game by playing in the local city and county softball leagues. She also worked for American Motors and the United States Postal Service.

September 30, 2021: Many thanks to KBHSAA Board members **Adela Lebron Hessefort '74** and **Dick Gentz '65** for their work at Bradford High School on July 16, organizing and packing up the Distinguished Alumni Award (DAA) plaques ahead of the construction project.

We had initially counted 12 plaques whose DAA honoree photos will need to be replaced or restored. Some of the photos looked OK in the frame, but when we took frames apart for cleaning, we found many photos were starting to delaminate and develop very fine cracks near the edges of the frame. We're pleased to report we now have all replacement photos of our DAA honorees in hand! In all, we've replaced 72 photos out of 116... our local Walgreens photo department staff know us by name now! We also discovered 10 of the DAA plaques have developed cracks (probably also due to the sun's UV rays), and we're working on mounting photos and bios on new plaques.

Some of the printed "bios" on the plaques had text that was obscured by the tacks holding the Plexiglass in place. We've worked to rekey those bios. Many thanks to KBHSAA Board member **Lee Arneson '57** for her assistance in proofreading them. We picked up the replacement bios in mid-September and, with help from **Adela Lebron Hesserfort**, we worked to place them under the Plexiglass on the plaques. Our photographer friend, **Don Sebetic '73**, has already photographed 40 of the 120 DAA plaques, and the next batch is ready to be delivered to him next week.

We've been working on our new web page, *Close-Up: DAA Honorees*, being developed as a replacement for our current **DAA Honorees** web page... we're excited to see this project moving forward and will let you know when the new webpage launches!

In browsing the KUSD Theatre Arts web page at the beginning of the month, we were excited to see a post indicating "auditions were held June 1-3, 2021. At the time of this release (August 2021), we are planning to welcome back our in-person audiences again, but due to the fluidity of COVID 19 we appreciate your patience and understanding should decisions regarding these procedures change.
