KBHSAA to honor 2018 Distinguished Alumni on June 16th



AUDREY A. HAINS, PH.D. - CLASS OF 1949

Dr. Audrey Hains was Director of Instructional Planning and Program Evaluation for KUSD, with responsibility for Chapter I/Title I and Bilingual programs. Prior to that assignment, she served as a principal of McKinley Junior High, assistant principal of Tremper High School and as principal of Grewenow, Durkee and Frank Elementary Schools.

Early in her career, Audrey taught grade levels from kindergarten to post-secondary. She also served as an adjunct professor in reading and assessment at Carthage and UW-Parkside. She received her B.S. in Elementary Education from Carthage College, M.S. in Curriculum and Instruction from UW-Milwaukee and Ph.D. in Educational Leadership from UW-Madison.

Audrey also served as a lead auditor, analyzing and assisting districts across the U.S. in the renovation of their school systems, and as a curriculum developer and trainer of school principals through CMAC.

An active physical lifestyle brings much joy to her life, as does her work with P.E.O., an organization of women who provide scholarships to girls, domestic and internationally, to further their formal education. She has been

very active in her local churches in Kenosha, Florida and Alabama. She and her husband raised four children, all college graduates.

DOMINIC G. "DON" SPERA - CLASS OF 1950

Dominic Spera's extensive career as a professional musician led to performances in New York City on TV and on Broadway, in the bands of Lionel Hampton, Benny Goodman and Tommy Dorsey, accompanying Johnny Mathis, Henry Mancini and Frank Sinatra, and playing with the Boston, Cleveland, Indianapolis, Pittsburgh and St. Louis Symphonies.

As a Bradford High School student, Dominic had played in Jazz, Pep and Marching Bands under Director Howard H. Dunham. At UW-Madison, he was First Trumpet with the Symphony Orchestra, soloist with the Concert Band and a member of the UW Marching Band for the famous 1953 Rose Bowl Game. Later, he played in the Fifth Army Band.

Dominic taught music for over 30 years. From 1968 to 1976, he taught Jazz and Trumpet at UW-Eau Claire. Down Beat Magazine cited his Jazz program as "a national success story," and he was awarded Jazz Educator of the Year. He then taught for 22 years at Indiana University's Jacobs School of Music, where he was named Professor Emeritus.

Dominic has been a prolific composer, writing over 100 jazz ensemble compositions and two Disney overtures. He holds BME, BM and MME degrees from Indiana University and was an inductee in the Inaugural Class of the Indiana University Jazz Hall of Fame.




EARLENE JORNT-GIRMAN - CLASS OF 1952

Earlene Jornt-Girman strategized how to launch her child care business at a time when women seldom worked outside the home. From early on, her childcare centers incorporated lesson plans, thoughtful curricula and trained teachers to provide lively learning environments. The enterprise grew to 10 locations in Southeast Wisconsin, eventually becoming a family-owned business, with Mark, her husband of more than 60 years, and a son joining in its management and operations.

Earlene returned to school, earning her B.S. in Education from Carthage College in 1977. She received her Master's in Child Development/Psychology from UW-Whitewater, sharing the stage with her daughter, an undergrad. Earlene went on to become an educator, deeply involved in teaching adults at Gateway and in the Milwaukee area and served on the Educational Advisory Board at Carthage College. She has also been active in Jr. Woman's Club, Kenosha Literacy Board, Rotary International and Kenosha Symphony Board.

Earlene's mentors from formative years taught her to enjoy and help people. Faith during joy and crisis has been a Blessing on her journey, since she was born to a family where many arms awaited to love, guide and rejoice with her.

Helping to Identify Richard Connell '41

In early February, we received a request through the KBHSAA website for assistance in locating a senior class photo of Richard L. Connell. Richard was born in Kenosha in March 1923 and was thought to have attended Kenosha Central High School, graduating in either 1940 or 1941. During World War II, he was a member of an 11-man crew that flew a B-29 from Saipan to Japan to bomb Japanese aircraft industry on November 27, 1944. On this particular mission, only this crew failed to return, with all 11 members lost at sea. Initially designated MIA, after search and rescue, all crew were classified as KIA.



The "500th Bomb Group" of which Richard was a part has an online site with considerable information about the personnel, missions and pictures of multiple 11 man crews. Unfortunately, while crew names are captioned in most of the pictures, with some, specific identities of individual crew members are unknown or are frequently mismatched with the individuals shown. One remedy for this problem has been to find a college or senior high school picture of the individual and compare it to the 11 individuals appearing in the crew photo.


We picked up 1940-1941 Spy yearbooks from KBHSAA archives at the ESC and quickly located Richard's senior class photo in the 1941 edition. We scanned and emailed it to the volunteer who had contacted us for assistance.

Our contact, John, is a volunteer with the 500th Bomb Group, working to help match names to the men pictured in the photos with their B-29 aircraft. He tells us most of the volunteers working on this project are sons, daughters and other immediate family of the men who actually flew these dangerous WWII missions. John got involved because his uncle was a bombardier-navigator with a different 500th B-29 crew, and he enjoys trying to put the pieces of the crew photo identification puzzle together. He tells us the final decision on corrected photo captioning rests with the officers of the 500th. When a corrected re-captioned crew photo is completed, John has promised to share a copy of it with KBHSAA. We were honored to be able to help out in this in this endeavor.
