

## KBHSAA to honor 2023 Distinguished Alumni

### *TOM SORENSEN, PsyD, CLASS OF 1961*



Tom graduated from UW-Madison in 1965 and entered graduate school in Philosophy but immediately began work in Clinical and Experimental Psychology at University Hospital and the Wisconsin Primate Center. Doing so whetted his appetite for psychology; he later earned two Master's degrees, an MA and an MS, and went on to earn a doctorate in Clinical Psychology. He studied Hemoencephalography with Hershel Toomin, targeting areas of the brain where lesions had formed due to strokes or TBI and working to rebuild damaged cortical structure by increasing oxygenated blood flow to the area. Tom's interest morphed into a study of Alzheimer's and how to prevent or improve function once it had taken root.

Tom still works full time, and his many tools include NASA-developed pulsed electromagnetic devices, near and far infrared lasers and brain wave entrainment. His research expanded into the use of certain brainwave frequencies to improve quality of life for those with temporal lobe epilepsy, using protocols developed by Dr. Barry Sterman of UCLA.

Dr. Sorensen writes, "I was privileged to have several professions in my life journey. My previous career in construction and my experiences at Lincoln Park as a youth linked me into the fabric of the working class. I always felt I was blue collar, regardless of titles or perception. Kenosha and Mary D. Bradford High School gave me an egalitarian service ethic during my career and the opportunity to treat patients who could not otherwise afford state-of-the-art medical treatment."

Rita graduated from St. Luke's Hospital School of Nursing in 1984. She completed her Bachelor of Science in Nursing from Marquette University and her Master's in Nursing from the University of Phoenix, all while working full-time and raising her family. Rita has served in leadership roles for 28 of her 38 years of nursing, beginning as a GI Coordinator at St. Catherine's Hospital through her current role as Executive Director of Hospice Alliance since 2012. Rita serves on the Wisconsin Hospice and Palliative Care Association board and chairs its Legislative Committee. She is an active member of the Kenosha County Long Term Care Alliance, serving as the chair, as well Kenosha County Care Transitions and leads its Advance Directive workgroup.

Rita is a member of Italian American Ladies Auxiliary and Contemporary Italian American Organization, Tempo Kenosha (past president), Kenosha Rotary Club (past president), Readers are Leaders Tutor, Wisconsin Nurse Honor Guard, Susan B. # First Free High School in Wisconsin

The lot for the 43'x70' two-story brick building, built at a cost of \$4,500, had been donated to the city by Sereno Fisk (right), an investor and businessman who had settled in Southport in 1844. On July 30, 1849 – about 14 months after Wisconsin gained statehood – the building was dedicated, and the next day school opened with an enrollment of 400 students.



was "the first free school outside of New England"; another popular claim is the "first west of the Alleghenies." According to the [Kenosha History Center](#), both of these are incorrect. There were free schools outside of New England before the United States even existed. And Kentucky and Ohio both had examples of free schools before Wisconsin was opened for settlement. But it was very likely the first in Wisconsin. The bronze tablet on the marker - placed by the Kenosha Chapter of the Daughters of the American Revolution on June 11, 1911 - recognizes the pioneers who worked to bring the dream of a free high school to what was then Southport: Michael Frank, Josiah Bond, Charles Clement, Reuben Deming, O. E. Dana, Charles Durkee, Harvey Durkee, Sereno Fisk, Samuel Hale, Henry B. Hinsdale, John B. Jilson, F. W. Lyman, Hayes McKinley, Theodore Newell, J. V. Quarles, C. Latham Sholes and Charles Sholes.

In 1848, the cornerstone was laid at the northeast corner of what is now 11th Avenue and 58th Street in Kenosha for what would become the first free high school in Wisconsin.



The original building was used until 1891, when crowded conditions made it necessary to build a larger structure. The building was raised to make way for what we fondly called "The Annex," which opened for classes in 1892.

The marker erected at the spot of the first High School claims it

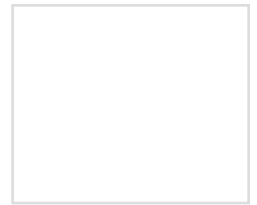
